WHAT WE DO

- Brush Farm Dog Training Club is a non-profit organisation run by a dedicated team of volunteers, committed to serving the local community and promoting responsible dog ownership. We teach people to train their dog to be socialised and obedient, and promote participation in canine obedience sports.
- Each year our club delivers over 300 hours of training classes, trains over 500 dogs, & runs three trials, attracting over 250 competitors from across Sydney
- Training provides a benefit to both dog owners and the wider community dogs that have participated in obedience training are less likely to be surrendered to pounds and animal shelters due to behavioural problems or aggression than dogs with no training.
- Attending training for just one hour each Sunday afternoon at Brush Farm Park will give you the skills to train your dog to be a happy, well behaved member of your family.

SETTING UP FOR SUCCESS When Adopting a New Dog



Adopting a new dog is all about changes for both of you. Use this guide to make the first few weeks fun and stress-free. You will build a foundation for a lasting relationship if you follow these steps to ...



ROUTINE

Dogs crave predictability. Stick to the same times when feeding, walking, training, and departing from your home.



TRAIN AT HOME FIRST

Start positive reinforement training at home for a distraction-free setting. This is the fastest, clearest way to establish communication.



OBSERVE YOUR DOG

When your dog is relaxed, what do their ears, mouth, tail position, and entire body look like? Learn your dog's body language to know when your dog is concerned and to identify triggers.



PRIVACY

Dogs, like people, need time to themselves. Create a spot with a crate or mat. Call your dog to leave their space, rather than invading their space.




TRAIN WITH FOOD

Shift calories out of the food bowl and use in short (5 minute) training sessions. Spread training sessions throughout the day, including reinforcing loose leash walking.




LET YOUR DOG INITIATE CONTACT

Let your dog initiate contact with people. Never force an interaction. If your dog solicits attention, pet on the chest, not on top of the head.



POSITIVE SOCIALIZATION

Limit interactions with new people, places, and things. Let your dog explore gradually in short sessions. Build positive



AVOID LEASH GREETINGS

Meeting other dogs can be stressful. Dogs don't always like each other. Limit or avoid greetings until you learn more about how your dog shows unease.



HAVE FUN WITH YOUR DOG!

Playing, feeding, walking, and interacting with your new dog builds a lasting bond. Take it easy the first month and get to know each other before widening the circle. After all, you have a lifetime together!

We have a bunch of teams competing across several different dog sports this year, which is FANTASTIC to see! It's lovely when all the skill-building, practice and teamwork start to pay off. Here is a selection of results from our trialling teams:

At the Royal Easter Show in April, competitors from Brush Farm performed excellently in this challenging environment with two teams gaining their Rally Novice title (Gemma & Hadley and Byron & Fenrir), two teams scoring qualifications in Rally Advanced (Karen & Banjo and Rocky & Taka), and Caitlin La Rose & Jessie qualifying in Rally Excellent.

Barbara Horsfield & Henri achieved their Open Obedience (CDX) title at the Central Coast Club trial in May. A fantastic achievement for this wonderful duo!

Janelle Woodward had great success in the Earthdog competition at Dogs NSW in May – Mudgee is on her way to Earthdog Champion with two Master level passes and a Senior level pass, while Poppy scored a Junior level pass.

Gemma-Louise Sherlock and Hadley have had lots of success recently in both Rally and Obedience – scoring a 2^{nd} place in CCD Obedience at Hills in May.

Kerry McDonald and Poppy have achieved their Rally Advanced title. Great job!

Belinda Young and Wilbur achieved their Trick Dog Starter title in January (scoring a 4th place in the ring on the day), and also scored a 2nd place finish in Rally Novice at Northern Suburbs.



2ND DOUBLE TRICK DOG TEST

On the June long weekend we held our second annual double Tricks Trial. Again, we were lucky to have beautiful weather!

Our judges on the day were Miss Vicki Etherington OAM, Mrs Judy Turley, Mrs Christiane Diebler, Miss Shanelle Corben and Miss Joan Stewart.

Huge thanks to our tireless Trial Secretary Alan Luc and the whole Brush Farm Committee for putting together this event, with a large number of competitors from across the state. And thank you to all our members who put up their hand to be stewards – we couldn't run these trials without you.

There were a number of Brush Farm teams participating and some excellent results were achieved! These included:

- Rocky Chau and Taka achieved a perfect score (80/80) in Novice
- Janelle Woodward and Mudgee got their first Trick Dog Starters qualification
- Colin Richardson and Georgia attained their Novice title and came 2nd in the ring
- Carmen Kong and Ben qualified and came 3rd in Novice
- Caitlin La Rose and Jessie achieved their Starters title
- Elizabeth Donohoo attained Starters titles for BOTH her dogs Cello and Strider

To give you an idea of what is required for the Trick Dog Starters level, you have to select 6 tricks to perform from the following list

- Go round (once)
- Circle handler (once)
- Circle spin (once)
- Leg Weave
- Nose to Hand Touch (2 x 2sec)
- Follow a Target Stick
- Step Up (paws on object 5sec)
- Paw on Hand (2sec)

- Back Up (1 body length)
- Send over Jump (from 1m)
- Take a Bow (2sec)
- Sendaway (from 2m)
- Find straddle (2sec)
- Stationary Hold (2sec)
- Sit Pretty/Paws on Arm (2sec

REMINDERS:

- Please do not leave your children unsupervised. Children running around may frighten or over-excite some dogs. Please remind your children NEVER to approach any dog without the handler's explicit permission
- Dogs wearing BRIGHT YELLOW KNITTED COLLARS may be uncomfortable around other people and dogs. Please give these dogs the space they need. If in doubt, MOVE YOUR DOG AWAY from stressful situations.
- All handlers must wear enclosed shoes for safety.
- All dogs must be kept ON LEASH unless an instructor tells you otherwise.
- Dogs that have a history of running off during off-leash exercises must use a long lead in class.
- Please pick up after your dog. Bags and bins are provided.



FIRST AID & OUR HEARTSTART HS1 DEFIBRILLATOR
